BOARD CONNECTION

It looks like summer is over. We would like to thank the Village residents for their patience during the high traffic times of the Concert Season. The Board would also like to convey a special "Thank You" to Tammy Pfalzer and Nick Newman for their work on the flower island on Main Street. We all appreciate that extra touch of beauty.

SEWER:

The Board would like to invite all residents to an **Open House** on Saturday, October 24th between 10:00am – 2:00pm at the Village Sewer Plant to get a tour and firsthand look at the improvements and upgrades from the recent Sewer Grant Project.

The Sewer Project is completed. Talks are continuing regarding potential of the Truck Stops connecting into the system. The Town is working on getting a grant for potential new hook-ups and adding capacity to the Village Plant. You can get more detailed information from the minutes on the Corfu and Pembroke websites.

SEWER BILLING REMINDER

Village of Corfu Sewer Law Section 1118 reads; "If there shall be any payments which are due to the Village of Corfu, or any Department thereof, pursuant to any Article or Section of this Law, which shall remain due and unpaid, in whole or in part, for a period of thirty (30) calendar days from the date of billing by the Village of Corfu, the same shall constitute a default, and there shall be added to the entire amount of the original bill a penalty equal to ten percent (10%) of the original bill, and interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of two percent (2%) per month, retroactive to the date of the original billing." If you pay your bill late and do not include all interest due, it will be added to your next bill, THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.

MAINTENANCE:

Pickup for leaves and brush will be on Mondays, Fridays and as work schedule and weather allows throughout the season. Please make sure there is no animal waste in the leaves. Please keep brush, branches and fallen nuts with husks separate from leaves, as the branches and nuts will plug the leaf vacuum. Brush and branches should be in manageable lengths not longer than 4 feet. If a large amount of branches must be disposed of, you may call for the Village trailer. You will be required to load the trailer, but there will be no charge for hauling the branches. Also remember there is NO OPEN BURNING! This is a STATE LAW and will be enforced!

During the week of Halloween we would appreciate that any leaves and brush needing to be picked up, have them out by the road by Thursday October 29th for pickup, as we would like to have the sidewalks and streets clear for the Trick or Treaters. We want to insure a safe night for the kids to enjoy. Also just a reminder, there will also be Christmas tree pickup after the holidays.

Prospect Avenue was paved this summer through the use of Chips funds from NYS DOT.

POLICE:

First, the Board would like to make our residents aware that Village Officer Pete Scanio was presented with a Certificate of Commendation for Outstanding Service for his lifesaving first aid call response on August 6, 2015. Officer Scanio is a credit to his profession!

The Board would also like to announce that Officer Mike Petritz is now a full-time officer for the Village of Corfu, so you'll be seeing him patrolling our streets more often.

We would also like to welcome new part-time Officer Ryan Young. We feel Ryan will be a great asset to our Village force.

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Craig Blake, as the Village Code Enforcement and Zoning Officer, has been hard at work in conjunction with the Village Board and Planning Board, actively contacting individuals that are in violation of various codes and attempting to work with them to take care of the violations in a timely manner. SNOW REMOVAL

We would like to remind Village residents that under the law, the removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. The Village will try to assist in the removal of snow from the sidewalks, however this does not and cannot reduce owner's responsibility. If everyone will abide by the following rules, it would facilitate snow removal in the Village.

Please do not pile snow from driveways onto the sidewalks, particularly after the Village plow has gone through.

Please remember there is a parking ban on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am from November 1st to April 30th. Vehicles in violation will be issued tickets and may be towed away. This is regardless of whether or not there is snow. Please do not park on sidewalks



Section 8,H of Local Law No. 1 of 1992 states it shall be unlawful for any dog owner to permit or allow a dog to create a nuisance by defecating, urinating or digging on public or private property other than the property of the said owner. This includes public sidewalks, the Cemetery and the Library. It is not a dog park.



STREETS OF CORFU

- ROUTE 33 (Main Street) Originally laid out in 1802 from Batavia to Buffalo and called "New Buffalo Road". When Corfu was first settled it became "Main Street" in Corfu. For a brief time in the 1880's East Main Street was called "Batavia Road". The portion outside the Village is now called "Genesee Street".
- ROUTE 77 (Alleghany Road) Originally laid out between 1800 1810. Because of a swamp, the original road did not come directly into the Village from the south until the railroad was built in 1852. It went east of the Village and then over to "New Buffalo Road". The portion from the four corners to the north has had several names: "Alabama Street", "Church Street", and "School Street" (1930).
- MAPLE AVENUE Probably built around 1852 when the railroad came to Corfu. It was originally called "Railroad Street" until about 1930, when it became "Maple Avenue". Until 1942 it went across the railroad tracks to the train depot south of the tracks.
- GANSON AVENUE It is not known when it was originally built. It possibly was part of the Alleghany by-pass into the Village in the early 1800's. It is first shown on a map in 1876 (no name is given on the map). The 1880 census calls it "Town Line Street". It is called "Ganson Avenue" on the 1927 map.
- PROSPECT AVE/ST Approved by the Village in 1871. It was briefly called "Summit Street" in the early 1900's, then called "Prospect" again in 1927. Some maps call it a Street and some an Avenue. Note on the map it shows a proposed subdivision with Propect connecting with Alleghany.
- DEPOT STREET Built in 1942 when the underpass was built. After the underpass was completed, the "Maple Avenue" crossing was closed and "Depot Street" was the only way to the train depot.
- WATER STREET Probably built around 1852 when the railroad came to Corfu. It was made a one-way street in 1976. A 1903 newspaper article calls it "River Street", only time I have found it called this.
- LAWRENCE AVENUE Built in 1952.
- MEADOWBROOK TERRACE Built in 1952, approved by Village in 1954.
- THOMPSON DRIVE Built in 1966.
- LONGS LANE Built in 1967, taken over by Village in 1971.
- FIELDCREST DRIVE Built in 1981 to connect the sewer plant to Main Street, was named "Fieldcrest" in 1988.
