# BOARD CONNECTION

It looks like summer is over. We would like to thank the Village residents for their patience during the high traffic times of the Concert Season.

## **SEWER:**

The TA Truck Stop has begun sending flow into the system. The Town is working on getting a grant for potential new hook-ups and adding capacity to the Village Plant. You can get more detailed information from the minutes on the Corfu and Pembroke websites.

## **SEWER BILLING REMINDER**

Village of Corfu Sewer Law Section 1118 reads; "If there shall be any payments which are due to the Village of Corfu, or any Department thereof, pursuant to any Article or Section of this Law, which shall remain due and unpaid, in whole or in part, for a period of **thirty (30) calendar days** from the date of billing by the Village of Corfu, the same shall constitute a default, and there shall be added to the entire amount of the original bill a penalty equal to **ten percent (10%)** of the original bill, and **interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of two percent (2%) per month**, retroactive to the date of the original billing." If you pay your bill late and do not include all interest due, it will be added to your next bill, **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.**

## **COSTLY CLOGS!**

We would like to remind everyone that disposing of grease, disposable wipes, and other personal hygiene products can cause blockages or clogs in the sewer system, which are very costly to remove. It is to your benefit as a taxpayer to avoid pouring grease down the drain or flushing disposable wipes or other personal hygiene products. Any establishments that serve food should also check and clean their grease traps on a regular basis. It is estimated that Buffalo NY spends \$6 million per year on grease abatement and removal. Although we are not a big city, the simple act of not disposing of grease, wipes and other products via your sink or toilets can save creating costly clogs and blockages in the system. Let's all help keep our sewer system "fat-free".

## **POLICE:**

We would like to welcome our new part-time Officers Jacob Gauthier, Jeffrey Pellittieri and Anthony Bartucca.

The Board is still in negotiations with the CSEA Police Union. New details will be passed on when they are available.

SNOW BIRDS NOTICE! Don't forget if you are going out of town for the winter or for any length of time, the Village Police will do "Property Checks" to keep a special eye on your home. If you would like to alert the Police to your upcoming absence, please come in to the Village Office to fill out a form so we will have your contact information in case it is needed.

## **ELECTIONS:**

Elections will be coming up on March 20, 2018. Just a reminder that caucuses must be held between January 23<sup>rd</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. Positions to be filled are two Trustees for 2 year terms. For further information contact the Village Office.

## **MAINTENANCE:**

Pickup for leaves and brush will be on Mondays and Fridays as work schedule and weather allows throughout the season. Please make sure there is no animal waste in the leaves. **Please keep brush, branches and fallen nuts with husks separate from leaves**, as the branches and nuts will plug the leaf vacuum. Brush and branches should be in manageable lengths not longer than 4 feet. If a large amount of branches must be disposed of, you may call for the Village trailer. You will be required to load the trailer, but there will be no charge for hauling the branches. Also, remember there is **NO OPEN BURNING!** This is a STATE LAW and will be enforced!

During the week of Halloween we would appreciate that any leaves and brush needing to be picked up, have them out by the road by Friday October 27<sup>th</sup> for pickup, as we would like to have the sidewalks and streets clear for the Trick or Treaters. Just a reminder there will be an Open House for the kids at the Fire Hall Tuesday October 31<sup>st</sup> from 6pm-9pm Halloween evening. We want to ensure a safe night for the kids to enjoy. Also don't forget there will be Christmas tree pickup after the holidays.

Meadowbrook Terrace and Lawrence Avenue were oiled and stoned this summer through the use of Chips funds from NYS DOT.

## **COMMITTEE NEWS:**

Winterfest is right around the corner on Saturday, January 27, 2018. The committee would appreciate any volunteers to help make this the best Winterfest ever. We encourage you to share your time and ideas. It will be held at the Corfu Intermediate School again this year. ## **ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT:**

Brian Schollard, as the Village Code Enforcement and Zoning Officer, has been hard at work in conjunction with the Village Board and Planning Board, actively contacting individuals that are in violation of various codes and attempting to work with them to take care of the violations in a timely manner. There has sometimes been some confusion regarding what type of work requires a Building permit as well as what constitutes a code violation. ## SNOW REMOVAL

We would like to remind Village residents that under the law, the removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. The Village will try to assist in the removal of snow from the sidewalks, however this does not and cannot reduce owner's responsibility. If everyone will abide by the following rules, it would facilitate snow removal in the Village.

Please do not pile snow from driveways onto the sidewalks, particularly after the Village plow has gone through.

Please remember there is a parking ban on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am from November 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>. Vehicles in violation will be issued tickets and may be towed away. This is regardless of whether or not there is snow. Please do not park on sidewalks or block sidewalks at any time.



Section 8,H of Local Law No. 1 of 1992 states it shall be unlawful for any dog owner to permit or allow a dog to create a nuisance by defecating, urinating or digging on public or private property other than the property of the said owner. This includes public sidewalks, the Cemetery and the Library. It is not a dog park.

## OCTOBER IS FIRE PREVENTION MONTH!

- If there is a fire, get outside quickly and stay outside, then call 911. If unable to get out call, 911 to let them know.

## HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS BY AL

### HISTORICAL TIDBITS

- On 10/13/1920 Henry Brown was struck and killed by a train near the Freight Depot on Railroad Avenue (now Maple Avenue)
- On a Sunday in May of 1908 Miss Dora Buckman of Corfu was at a home in Crittenden where suddenly about 10:30pm she became unconscious. Efforts by the homeowner and several doctors could not wake her. Her breathing and vital signs were normal. Miss Buckman stayed in this "trance" for a week. None of the doctors or specialists could determine the cause. Suddenly a week later she came out of it. Other than being weak she was fine. No reason for the "trance" was ever found and it never happened again.
- Through the years there have been several robberies of the Corfu Post Office.
  - On 6/29/1900, \$250 was taken when thieves blew up the safe. (At that time the Post Office was located where Burling Drugs was located.)
  - Later in 1900 thieves again tried to rob the Post Office. An alarm had been set up at Mr. Egloff's house across the street. It sounded and Mr. Egloff shot and wounded one of the thieves from his front porch.
  - A 1914 Daily News article reported that there were robbery attempts in 1905, 1907, 1912 and twice in 1914. No other information was given on these attempts.
- In 1868 Corfu became an "Incorporated Village". 2018 will be the Sesquicentennial of this Incorporation. In 1968 the Village held a "Centennial Celebration" of Incorporation which included a parade and many special events throughout the day.
- Thank you to all those who came to this year's "Brick House Fair". Also thanks to all who have attended the Corfu United Presbyterian Church's Bi-centennial events this year.
- Hope to see you at the 2018 "Winterfest" to kick off the Village Sesquicentennial on Saturday January 27<sup>th</sup> at the Corfu Intermediate School.

## Corfu Fire District News

The Corfu Fire District has raised its budget only 1 ½ percent for 2018. This corresponds to a decrease of \$.136 per \$1,000 valuation, which should mean a lower fire protection tax bill for most. This \$2,000 total increase, however is to offset the nearly \$2,000 increase the district must pay to Genesee County for our share of their Self-Insurance Worker Compensation.

Corfu Firefighters have put into service 13 new SCBA's purchased through the federal government's Assistance to Firefighters Grant Awards. The Corfu Fire District was successful in securing the grant through efforts of Rosalie Mangino-Crandall and her Insights Grants Development Company. She donated her time for the Corfu project which is greatly appreciated by the department.

The newest and latest model of SCBA's replaced our outdated 1997 NFPA edition SCBA's that have been costly to repair and were at the end of their life cycle. The grant enabled the district to purchase thirteen (13) complete units and one (1) mask integrated radio blue tooth. The total cost of the grant is \$88,400, with the district's share of \$4,209. This will insure our firefighters are well protected and have the latest technology available to them for the foreseeable future at a small cost to the taxpayers of the Corfu Fire District.

Don't forget the Fire Department is having a Halloween Open House on October 31<sup>st</sup> between 6pm and 9pm with kid's activities, games and prizes. There will also be coffee, cider and donuts. Let's have a safe Halloween!

The Fire Department is also co-sponsoring the Christmas Toy Drive in conjunction with the Corfu Police Department and Corfu Presbyterian Church to benefit local children. Toys may be dropped off at the Fire Department on Monday nights, at the Village Office Monday-Friday 9am-5pm or at the Presbyterian Church Open House on December 3<sup>rd</sup> between 12pm – 3pm.

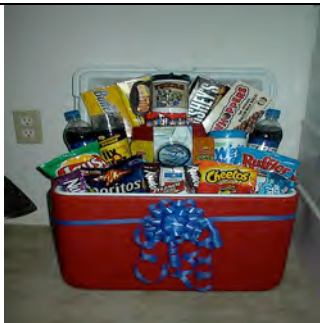

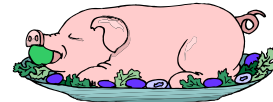
