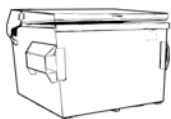

BOARD CONNECTION

First, congrats to incumbent Trustees Ken Lauer and Tom Sargent. We are confident they will continue be an asset to the Village for the upcoming two years. Trustee Jenny McMartin-Eck was also named Deputy Mayor.

MAINTENANCE:

Hopefully by the time you receive this, spring will be here to stay. Residents are already beginning their spring cleanup as things dry out. Maintenance will be making the rounds on a regular basis to keep the branches and brush picked up. Pick up is generally scheduled for Mondays and Fridays. If you have large amounts of brush or debris please contact the Village office, as we may be able to pick it up on site rather than you having to haul it to roadside or you may call for the Village trailer. You will be required to load the trailer, but there will be no charge for hauling the branches.

SPRING ROLLOFF is Friday April 27th, 7am-2pm and Saturday April 28th, 8am-11am.

We request that you do not bring any recyclable items such as glass, tin cans, or No.1 and 2 plastics. These should be put with your curbside service. These items can also be taken to the Town of Pembroke Recycling Center on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month. They also accept newspapers and magazines. Paper recycling is also available at the Corfu Free Library.

We cannot accept the following items: tires, oil, garbage, toxic materials, refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners, unless freon has been removed. Paint cans will only be accepted if empty and lid removed. We will accept car batteries, couches, stoves, dishwashers and mattresses. If you need help with large items, please call the Village Office at 599-3327.

The Village reserves the right to reject large amounts of trash and to stop receiving once the container is full. We suggest that residents who are doing major remodeling work to please contract for their own dumpster for trash removal. This service is intended for residential use.

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT:

Brian Schollard, our Village Code Enforcement and Zoning Officer, has been hard at work in conjunction with the Village Board and Planning Board, actively contacting individuals that are in violation of various codes and attempting to work with them to take care of the violations in a timely manner. State regulations often make clearing up the violations a difficult and lengthy procedure. Brian and the Planning Board have also been working with Triton Homes on the development of a small subdivision to be located on Fieldcrest Drive and Ron Long on the Senior Housing development scheduled to go behind the Market.

GRANTS:

We are pleased to announce that we have been allotted \$1,685 from Stop DWI for additional patrol hours to combat drunk driving. The Village was also awarded a STEP grant in the amount of \$1,105 for patrol hours for Highway Safety. Other grant applications are in the works in an effort to save money and improve the Village.

POLICE:

The Board is still in negotiations with the CSEA Police Union. New details will be passed on when they are available.

In case you noticed we had a substitute Crossing Guard for awhile. Our long-time Crossing Guard, Charlie Lenhard broke a bone in his leg and was out of commission for several weeks. A big "Thank You" to Brian Schollard for stepping up to help out during those weeks and a big "Welcome Back" to Charlie.

SEWER:

The TA Truck Stop is now hooked into our Sewer plant. The Town of Pembroke is working on getting grants for an addition to our Sewer plant on the land transferred to the Village from Triton Properties. The addition will accommodate additional flow from the Town including Yancey’s Fancy proposed up-sizing as well as other Pembroke potential hook-ins to the system.

COMMITTEE NEWS:

The Board would like to thank the Winterfest Committee for coordinating a successful Winterfest in January. In 2018 the Village celebrates 150 years of being incorporated.

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS BY AL

- With the possibility of a new Grocery Store coming to the Village, the first General Store opened in 1832, located where the Gun Shop is now.
- William Scott of “Scott’s Greenhouses” was the head gardener for the “Pan American Expo” in 1901 in Buffalo. In 1933 David Scott was a judge at the National Flower Show in St. Louis.
- In 1861, L.D. Stevens was robbed of over \$4000 near the Corfu Depot.
- May 19, 1898 “Corfu Enterprise”, a weekly paper was started by A.A. Bloomfield & Son,. It was bought by Clarence E. Curtiss and taken over by his son, Harold E. Curtiss. The newspaper ceased operation Dec. 31, 1944, but job printing was done until 1964. The building (located on Alleghany Road near the underpass) was burned to the ground the fall of 1975 by an arsonist, and never rebuilt.
- Randolph Kinne opened a store on the northeast corner (where M&T Bank now stands); later called Ogden's Corners, as Alfred E. Ogden operated it from 1881. This building burned in Corfu's first large fire in 1899, and the lot sat vacant until the bank was built in 1927.
- In 1903 the Fire Department collected \$150 in taxes for the year.
- In April of 1905 the Village Board voted to re-incorporate.
- In April of 1905 the Village Board voted to buy a snow plow for \$150.
- On October 12, 1918 all Corfu Churches and Corfu School closed due to an influenza epidemic. The “Spanish Flu Epidemic of 1918” killed over 100 people in Genesee County.
- A World War 1 exhibition train spent the day in Corfu on October 7, 1918.

SEWER REMINDER

Village of Corfu Sewer Law Section 1118 reads; “If there shall be any payments which are due to the Village of Corfu, or any Department thereof, pursuant to any Article or Section of this Law, which shall remain due and unpaid, in whole or in part, for a period of **thirty (30) calendar days** from the date of billing by the Village of Corfu, the same shall constitute a default, and there shall be added to the entire amount of the original bill a penalty equal to **ten percent (10%)** of the original bill, and **interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of two percent (2%) per month**, retroactive to the date of the original billing.” If you pay your bill late and do not include all interest due, it will be added to your next bill, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Just a reminder that Your Sewer bill reading is based on the MCWA water usage. Estimated readings may end up costing you more.

PLEASE SEND YOUR ACTUAL READING TO MONROE COUNTY WATER

SWIMMING POOLS

Reminder: Pool credits can be given on sewer bills only if water readings are given to the Village Office prior to filling and after filling pool and totals over 5000 gallons. Also remember when emptying pools DO NOT empty them into a neighbor’s yard. By law, you cannot create a water problem for neighboring property. Also please note that permits and electrical inspections are required on pools. For more information on pool requirements contact Brian Schollard at codeenforcement@corfuny.com.

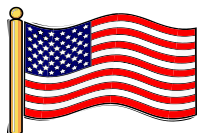

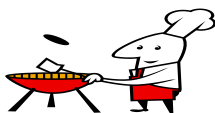
