SEWER REMINDER

Per Village of Corfu Sewer Law Section 1118, if there are any payments due on your Corfu Sewer for a period of **30 calendar days** from the date of billing, there will be added to the entire amount of the original bill a penalty equal to **10%** of the original bill. **Interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of 2% per month** retroactive to the date of the original billing. If you pay your bill late and do not include penalty or interest due, it will be added to your next bill. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

BOARD CONNECTION

Summer is here and we would like to remind everyone that without an ample amount of rain, the vegetation is dry and more vulnerable to fire. Also with the heat, everyone, not just children and pets are subject to heat stroke. Please be extra cautious during this hot, dry season. Also remember there is no open burning allowed in the Village per State Law.

MAINTENANCE:

It has been a busy season for our Maintenance department. Jesse has been working on creek cleanout and in conjunction with Camden Group on some sewer projects. Jesse is still making the rounds on a regular basis to keep the branches and brush picked up. Pick up is generally scheduled for Mondays and Fridays. If you have large amounts of brush or debris please contact the Village office, as we may be able to pick it up on site rather than you having to haul it to roadside or you may call for the Village trailer. You will be required to load the trailer, but there will be no charge for hauling the branches.

FALL ROLLOFF is Friday Sept 9th, 7am-2pm and Saturday Sept 10th, 8am-11am.

We request that you <u>do not</u> bring any recyclable items such as glass, tin cans, or No.1 and 2 plastics. These should be put with your curbside service. These items can also be taken to the Town of Pembroke Recycling Center on the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Saturday of each month. They also accept newspapers and magazines. Paper recycling is also available at the Corfu Free Library.

We cannot accept the following items: tires, oil, garbage, toxic materials, refrigerators, freezers or air conditioners, unless freon has been removed. Paint cans will only be accepted if empty and lid removed. We will accept car batteries, couches, stoves, dishwashers and mattresses. If you need help with large items, please call the Village Office at 599-3327.

The Village reserves the right to reject large amounts of trash and to stop receiving once the container is full. <u>We suggest that residents who are doing major remodeling work to please contract for their own dumpster for trash removal.</u> This service is intended for residential use.

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Planning Board has still been working with Triton Homes on the development of a small subdivision to be located on Fieldcrest Drive. They are to the point of obtaining some permits then should be ready to roll.

COMMITTEE NEWS:

The 2017 Winterfest will be January 28, 2017. We are always looking for volunteers to help with planning this fun yearly event. The Committee will also be looking forward to 2018 when the Village celebrates 150 years of being incorporated. Village Historian Al Starkweather is willing to work with those interested in setting up a 2018 Sesquicentennial celebration. If anyone is interested please contact the Village Office.

SEWER:

The Sewer plant will be undergoing a few more upgrades thanks to the upcoming grant award from Senator Ranzenhofer. We are just waiting for all the preliminary paperwork to be approved. Potential new districts are being looked at and the TA Truck Stop has begun engineering schematics for hook-up into the system.

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS BY AL

Besides our annual Memorial Day parade, Corfu used to have yearly celebrations on the Fourth of July. Here are notes on a few of them:

- In 1903 it started with a 50 gun salute at sunrise. They had a parade at 10:00 am followed by a speech at 11:30 am. In the afternoon there was a Tug-of-war, 100 yard dash, greased pig races, greased pole climb and pie eating contests. At 3:30 pm there was a baseball game between Corfu and the Buffalo Knights of Columbus. In the evening there was a dance and fireworks.
- In 1904 there was a 5 mile bike race at 10:00 am and parade at 11:00 am. In the afternoon there was a concert, Acrobatic show, various contests and a baseball game. In the evening, there were avrobats, a concert and dancing at the Opera House. It finished with fireworks at dusk.
- In 1909 they had a baseball game, parade and fireworks.
- In 1919 the Village strung electric lights across Main Street and had many events and fireworks.
- The New York Central Railroad would run special trains from Batavia for the Corfu celebrations.

BANNER UPDATE!

The Village has been informed by NYS DOT that the sponsored banners are not allowable according to their criteria for acceptable banners, which does not allow advertising banners. They are allowing us to keep them up until November 1st, and then all sponsored banners will have to be removed.
