BOARD CONNECTION

Happy New Year from your Village Board! It's been an unpredictable winter so far, from one extreme to the other. We hope all our residents got through the November blizzard without any major mishaps. We would like to commend Jesse Stocking and all those who assisted, for their tireless work cleaning up after the November blizzard. A job well done!

SEWER PROJECT:

The Sewer Project is in its final stages. A majority of the Town residents are now hooked into the Village Plant. Final landscaping and cleanup will be taking place in the spring. In the Village, maintenance and Camden Group have been working with the Town of Pembroke to assure a smooth transition with the new system and we are still on schedule for a spring completion. This is truly a joint venture with the Town and a perfect example of working together for the good of the community. POLICE:

Members of the Board on the negotiating committee recently met with the CSEA Union for negotiations on the Police Contract. They will be meeting again in the near future to further review and amend the proposed contract. It is still pending and new details will be passed on when they are available.

PLANNING BOARD:

The Planning Board has been working with Triton Homes regarding a potential small subdivision to be located on Fieldcrest Drive at the west end of the Village. The Planning Board, along with Code Enforcement Officer Craig Blake, has also been working on solutions to take care of some of the abandoned or neglected properties in the Village.

GRANTS:

The Village is pleased to announce the award of a \$2,267.00 grant from Genesee County Stop-DWI program for 2015. The grant will cover some additional police coverage for DWI patrols, especially during Concert season, as well as some DWI related equipment. Thanks to Officer Rich Retzlaff for his work on obtaining this grant.

An application has also been submitted for the annual JCAP (Justice Court) grant to be used for secure Court storage and some office equipment. Awards for this grant have not been announced yet.

BUDGET:

It's that time of year again and the Board has begun work on the 2015-16 annual budget. A budget meeting has been scheduled for January 20th at 6:30 pm, as well as during regular Board meetings. The Board always appreciates the feedback of the residents during these trying financial times. All of these meetings are open to the public.

ELECTIONS:

We want to remind you that the Republican Caucus will be held Tuesday, January 20, 2015 at 7:00 pm and the Democratic Caucus will be held Tuesday, January 20, 2015 at 5:30 pm. Both Caucuses will be held at the Community Center. You do have a say in who represents you in Village government. Attend your party caucus and speak up! Also please note that due to St. Patrick's Day holiday, Village elections will take place on <u>Wednesday</u>, March 18, 2015 at the Community Center between 12 noon and 9:00 pm.

DISSOLUTION COMMITTEE:

The Dissolution Steering Committee has been meeting regularly to review and discuss whether dissolution of the Village will benefit the taxpayers, as well as explore the continuation of various services the Village residents now receive. The plan is being developed with the expectation that upon the dissolution of the Village, the succeeding Town government will provide for and comply with the plan as set forth. Once the complete dissolution plan is drawn up, the next step will be a formal Public Hearing to present the final plan, which accomplishes two things; First, it provides an opportunity for those affected by the proposal to comment on it; Second, the date on which the Public Hearing is held is used as the date the proposal was formally "presented", to make sure there is proper timing between the submission of the dissolution proposition to referendum (the Public Hearing) and the date on which the public will vote on the proposition, as the Law requires.

If the proposition to dissolve the Village is approved by a majority of qualified voters, the Village of Corfu could be dissolved as of December 31, 2016, or sooner. If the proposition to dissolve the Village is not approved by a majority of those voting on the question, the Village will continue to operate as before the vote.

The dissolution plan will address not only how Village functions or services will continue if the Village dissolves, but also which aspects of Village government will change due to merging two governments into one.

Following are some of the key elements that will be addressed in some detail in the final dissolution plan:

- Disposition of real property, equipment and fixed assets;
- Continuation of specified services;
- Elimination of existing positions;
- Future employment and continuation of benefits for employees that will transition to Town;
- · Continuation, elimination or modification of local laws;
- Provisions for existing debt and obligations, and impact of recurring obligations;
- · Transition of Village records and books to the Town;
- Village revenues that will become Town revenues;
- Projection of expenses and tax implications of the dissolution of the Village into the Town;
- Planning, Zoning and Code Enforcement transition to the Town
- Transition of water and sewer services for Village residents to the Town

The Steering Committee has their next meeting scheduled for January 15th. Once a final draft of the dissolution plan is agreed upon by the committee, it will go to the Village Board for adoption and the date for the Public hearing will be set and advertised. Once adopted, a copy of the proposed final plan will be available at the Village Office and on the Village website prior to the Public hearing for residents to review.

Don't forget, this is just a committee to examine and explore the potential benefits or ramifications of a Village Dissolution. It is you, the residents, who have the final say! All meetings are advertised open meetings. Your opinion is important!



SNOW REMOVAL

We would like to remind Village residents that under the law, the removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. The Village will try to assist in the removal of snow from the sidewalks, however this does not and cannot reduce owner's responsibility. If everyone will abide by the rules, it would facilitate snow removal in the Village.

- 1) Please do not pile snow from driveways onto the sidewalks, particularly after the Village plow has gone through. Do not block sidewalks at any time!
- 2) Remember there is a parking ban on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am from Nov. 1st to April 30th. Vehicles in violation will be issued tickets and may be towed away. This is regardless of whether or not there is snow.

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS BY AL

Historical Tidbits!

- On October 28, 1865, a "Great Squirrel Hunt" was held in Corfu. Captain Jones' team got 867 squirrels and Captain Edwards' team got 547. During the hunt, Mr. Winans caught the largest white owl ever seen in this area. He put it on display at his Union Hotel in Corfu. (from Progressive Batavian)
- Frank Edwards was struck and killed by lightning on September 30, 1879. Mr. Edwards, his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Farnum and two children were in Mr. Edwards' carriage and had started out on an afternoon drive. A thunderstorm with driving rain came up unexpectedly. They pulled up under a tree near Evergreen Hill Cemetery. A bolt of lightning struck the tree, splitting it in half. Mr. Edwards fell back into Mrs. Farnum's (his sister) arms and the horses fell over. The horses and Mr. Edwards were dead. No one else was injured. (from Batavia Daily)
- On July 1. 1903, the New York Central Railroad sold round trip tickets from Batavia to Corfu for 35 cents for the big Fourth of July celebration in Corfu. (from Batavia Daily)
- On May 23, 1903 it was reported that James Farnum of Corfu had grown two novelty trees in his greenhouse. One was a 1 ½ foot orange tree that bore several walnut size oranges. The other was a lemon tree about 2 feet high. The Lemon tree is now in bloom and has several lemons on it. The lemons are larger than normal and have a better flavor. (from Batavia Daily)
- On October 4, 1917 a large concert was held in Corfu. Bands from Corfu, Batavia, Clarence, Attica, Darien and Alexander all attended. (from Corfu Enterprise)
- The streets of Corfu were covered with oil by the Standard Oil Company on June 17, 1919. (from Corfu Enterprise)
- On May 22, 1966, Susan Wilson (20) from Watertown was visiting friends at the corner of East Main and Meadowbrook Terrace, when she was killed when a pistol was accidently discharged. The shot went through a wall and struck Susan in the next room. (from Batavia Daily)
