BOARD CONNECTION

It looks like summer is over. We would like to thank the Village residents for their patience during the high traffic times of the Concert Season.

SEWER:

The Town of Pembroke is working on getting a grant for potential new hook-ups and adding capacity to the Village Plant. They are currently waiting for the award list from NYS for grant funding. You can get more detailed information from the minutes on the Corfu and Pembroke websites.

SEWER BILLING REMINDER

Village of Corfu Sewer Law Section 1118 reads; "If there shall be any payments which are due to the Village of Corfu, or any Department thereof, pursuant to any Article or Section of this Law, which shall remain due and unpaid, in whole or in part, for a period of **thirty (30) calendar days** from the date of billing by the Village of Corfu, the same shall constitute a default, and there shall be added to the entire amount of the original bill a penalty equal to **ten percent (10%)** of the original bill, and **interest shall accrue on the unpaid balance at a rate of two percent (2%) per month**, retroactive to the date of the original billing." If you pay your bill late and do not include all interest due, it will be added to your next bill. <u>THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS</u>.

COSTLY CLOGS!

We would like to remind everyone that disposing of grease, disposable wipes, and other personal hygiene products can cause blockages or clogs in the sewer system, which are very costly to remove. Although we are not a big city, the simple act of <u>not</u> disposing of grease, wipes and other products via your sink or toilets can help prevent costly clogs and blockages in the system. Let's all help keep our sewer system "fat-free".

The Sewer Department will be spot checking to locate any illegal hookups to the Sanitary Sewer system, such as sump pumps. You could be fined if found to have an illegal hookup.

POLICE:

We would like to welcome our new part-time Officers Scott Johnston, Kevin Koscielniak, David Krzemien and Patrick Reeves.

SNOW BIRDS NOTICE! Don't forget if you are going out of town for the winter or for any length of time, the Village Police will do "Property Checks" to keep a special eye on your home. If you would like to alert the Police to your upcoming absence, please come in to the Village Office to fill out a form so we will have your contact information in case it is needed.

GRANT INFO:

This fall the Village police will be utilizing our 2018 DWI grant with specialized DWI patrols. The Village Police were also awarded a STEP Grant for \$1105.00 and a Law Enforcement Grant for \$2800.00. We are still waiting for the preliminary paperwork to be approved on the grant award from Senator Ranzenhofer for the Sewer Upgrades.

ELECTIONS:

Elections will be coming up on Tuesday March 19, 2019. Just a reminder that caucuses must be held between January 22nd and 29th and advertised 10 days before the caucus. Positions to be filled are Mayor and two Trustees for 2 year terms. For further information contact the Village Office.

MAINTENANCE:

Pickup for leaves and brush will be on Monday and Fridays, or as work schedule and weather allows throughout the season. Please make sure there is <u>no animal waste</u> in the leaves. **Please keep brush, branches and fallen nuts with husks separate from leaves,** as the branches and nuts will plug the leaf vacuum. Brush and branches should be in manageable lengths not longer than 4 feet. If a large amount of branches must be disposed of, you may call for the Village trailer. You will be required to load the trailer, but there will be no charge for hauling the branches. Also, remember there is **NO OPEN BURNING!** This is a STATE LAW and will be enforced!

During the week of Halloween we would appreciate that any leaves and brush needing to be picked up, have them out by the road by Friday October 26th for pickup, as we would like to have the sidewalks and streets clear for the Trick or Treaters. We want to ensure a safe night for the kids to enjoy. Just a reminder there will be an Open House for the kids at the Fire Hall Wednesday October 31st from 6:30pm-8:30pm Halloween evening. Also don't forget there will be Christmas tree pickup after the holidays.

Water Street and Maple Avenue were oiled and stoned this summer through the use of Chips funds from NYS DOT. Several slabs of sidewalk were also replaced.

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT:

The Village Code Enforcement and Zoning Officer, Brian Schollard, has been working in conjunction with the Village Board and Planning Board to facilitate building permits for several individuals. He is also working on contacting individuals that are in violation of various codes and attempting to work with them to take care of the violations in a timely manner. SNOW REMOVAL

We would like to remind Village residents that under the law, the removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. The Village will try to assist in the removal of snow from the sidewalks, however this <u>does not and cannot</u> reduce owner's responsibility. If everyone will abide by the following rules, it would facilitate snow removal in the Village.

Please do not pile snow from driveways onto the sidewalks, particularly after the Village plow has gone through.

Please remember there is a parking ban on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am from November 1^{st} to April 30th. Vehicles in violation will be issued tickets and may be towed away. This is regardless of whether or not there is snow. Please do not park on sidewalks or block sidewalks at any time.



Section 8,H of Local Law No. 1 of 1992 states it shall be unlawful for any dog owner to permit or allow a dog to create a nuisance by defecating, urinating or digging on public or private property other than the property of the said owner. This includes public sidewalks, the Cemetery and the Library. It is not a dog park.

OCTOBER IS FIRE PREVENTION MONTH!

HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS BY AL HISTORICAL TIDBITS

I would like to thank all those that attended or volunteered at the Brick House Fair in September. With the start of the Fieldcrest Meadows subdivision near the Sewer plant I thought I would mention a few other housing developments in the past.

- <u>Lawrence Avenue</u>; was approved by the Village Board and began construction in 1952. It was built on land from the Lawrence family and was extended in 1979.
- <u>Meadowbrook Terrace</u>; Local realtor Alvin Miller began this development in 1952. Wilma Starkweather won a contest to name it Meadowbrook Terrace. It was 1954 before it was approved by the Village Board.
- <u>Thompson Drive</u>; A group of local businessmen started this project in 1966 on land owned by the Thompson family. Later that same year it was dedicated to the Village.
- <u>Longs Lane</u>; The same group of businessmen began this in 1967. It runs parallel to Main Street between Main Street and the railroad tracks and connects to Thompson Drive. It is named after the Long family, founders of the Village. Part was dedicated to the Village in 1971, the rest in 1973.
- <u>Genesee Heights</u>; This is not an official Village street but has over 40 modular units located here. It was started by Al Bontrager and Calvin Beachy and is now owned by Ron Witkop. The land was annexed to the Village in 1990 and the development was approved by the Village in 1991.
- <u>Fieldcrest Drive</u>; A road was built in 1981 to connect the new sewer plant to Main Street. It was named Fieldcrest Drive in 1988. A new housing development, Fieldcrest Meadows owned by Triton Real Estate was started in 2018. They plan to have 17 units.
- Soon to be in the works is Corfu Commons Apartments to be located at 49 West Main Street (the Market property).

UPCOMING PEMBROKE 2018 - 19 HISTORICAL PROGRAMS

The Town of Pembroke Historical programs are the first Wednesday of the months of October, November, April, May and June. November 7, 2018 Greg Kinal will present a new program on D-Day. Corfu Fire District News

The Corfu Fire District has entered into a contract with E-One Inc. from Hamburg NY to rechassis, refurbish, and rebuild our 1998 Engine Tanker. Delivery will be in later 2019. The cost is \$265,000. A new chassis will be utilized with the 1998 stainless steel body and the pump. Refurbishing and rebuilding these components will result in a substantial cost savings to the taxpayers in excess of \$80,000 over purchasing a completely new engine.

The Corfu Fire District has been setting funds aside each year for equipment purchases. This has allowed the district to save enough funds so we do not have to borrow money for this project. This is the first time the tax payers have not had to borrow funds to purchase fire apparatus since 1952.

The Commissioners of the Corfu Fire District are keeping next year's budget increase to New York State's tax cap of 2%. This increase will only add \$2,700 to the overall budget. New York State passed this year, the Volunteer Cancer Law covering our volunteer interior firefighters. This is a much needed law; however it must be funded by the Fire District. This insurance along with the increase Genesee County is charging the fire district for Workers Comp. is costing over \$4,000. These increases in insurance and other parts of our budget are being offset by lowering funds going into savings for future fire apparatus.

Don't forget the Fire Department is having a Halloween Open House at the Fire Hall on October 31st between 6:30 pm and 9:30 pm with kid's activities, games and prizes. There will also be coffee, cider and donuts. Let's have a safe Halloween!

The Fire Department is also co-sponsoring the Christmas Toy Drive in conjunction with the Village of Corfu and Corfu Presbyterian Church to benefit local children. Toys may be dropped off at the Fire Department on Monday nights, at the Village Office Monday-Friday 9am-4pm or at the Presbyterian Church.
