

December 10, 2012

Mayor Skeet opened Regular meeting at 6:30 pm.

Members present were Mayor Skeet, Trustees Graham, Peterson and Ianni. Also present were Deputy Clerk Denise Beal. (Trustee Lauer arrived at 7:00 pm.)

Trustees reviewed bills.

Village Attorney Mark Boylan arrived at 6:40pm. Village Officers Richard Retzlaff, Gene Nati and Simon Biegaszewicz arrived at 6:45 pm.

Attorney Boylan gave a brief update on a meeting with the Office of Court Administration (OCA) held on November 29th in Buffalo. Attorney Boylan, Judge Robert Alexander, Village Trustees Al Graham and Ralph Peterson were in attendance at the OCA meeting. Also in attendance were OCA supervising Justices Marky and Boller, Administrator Eisenberg and two representatives from Albany on video conference.

Attorney Boylan informed the Board that the meeting was held to discuss the role of the Village Justice versus the Village Board in affairs of the Court. He said the essence of the conversation was that the Village Board has no interest in micromanaging the affairs of the Justice on day-to-day operation of the court, but the Village Board is responsible for the welfare and well-being of its employees. He said they also expressed that the Judge cannot harass employees and does not have the authorization to fire the court clerk or tell her she cannot talk to Board members.

He said OCA stressed that the Judge cannot cancel another court and should have the acting Justice take his place if he is not available. They were in agreement that the court clerk's hours should be left at 8am-4pm. Attorney Boylan also mentioned that a letter he had sent to the Judge was read and OCA attorneys agreed that the letter does not specify that the Judge cannot speak to the court clerk, only that he cannot harass her.

Attorney Boylan was questioned if the Insurance Company would allow extensions until resolution is reached on what happened to the missing money. He said they need a police investigation, which can occur once Judicial Conduct is done with their investigation. He said then the State Comptroller can engage law enforcement to pursue the criminal investigation and the insurance company can go after restitution.

Attorney Boylan left the meeting at 6:50 pm.

Officers Retzlaff, Nati and Biegaszewicz were questioned as to the reason for their attendance at the meeting. They said they had some complaints about the administrator of the Police department. It was agreed to go into executive session to discuss their personnel issues.

Motion was made by Trustee Ianni and seconded by Trustee Graham to go into executive session at 6:55 pm to discuss personnel issues.

The Board conveyed their apologies to Mike Brown of New Wave Energy for the delay in meeting with him. Mr. Brown handed out and explained an analysis on potential cost savings on energy bills by changing to his company as the Village's energy supplier. He stressed that by going with an outside supplier it would eliminate several fees (ESRM, Tariff, Merchant Function fees) charged by National Grid. He said even if their supply rate rose above that of National Grid, with eliminated fees their service would still result in savings for the Village. After answering a few questions, Mr. Brown left the meeting at 8:30 pm.
